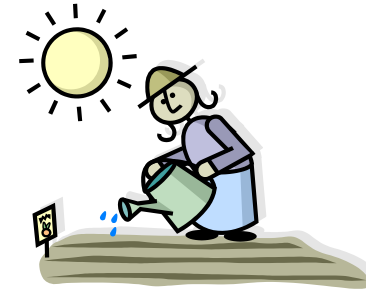

The *Learning Through Gardening* program is a K – 5 program which increases student understanding of many science, social studies, mathematics and literature concepts using the garden for hands-on approaches and problem solving techniques. A recent study indicated that students using these approaches perform better on standardized measures of academic achievement in reading, writing, math, science and social studies; that discipline and classroom management improves; that students increase their engagement and enthusiasm for learning; and have greater pride and ownership in their accomplishments. These are the goals that the *Learning Through Gardening* program seeks to support and achieve.

**As a recipient of a *Learning Through Gardening* Grant, your school will receive:**

- Materials to build 2-4'x15' raised vinyl sided beds, growing medium, seeds/vegetable plugs, tools and hoses
- September kick-off pep rally
- Guidance from experts in the agricultural industry
- Lesson plans to coordinate your outdoor garden experience with your everyday curriculum
- *Cultivating the Curriculum* workshop conducted for the staff at your school
- Opportunity to participate in the statewide poster and essay contests
- 10 additional professional development credits for staff that serve on garden committee

**As a recipient, your school will be required to:**

- Provide adequate garden and workspace for children
- Appoint a committee of at least 3 teachers representing various grade levels
- Submit a garden plan outlining involvement of each grade level throughout the entire year
- Have each teacher teach at least one lesson per month pertaining to gardening or agriculture
- Have classroom staff attend *Cultivate the Curriculum* workshop at your school
- Have committee members attend a Best Practices Workshop in June to meet and share experiences with other schools' committees
